SCRIPTURE

Luke 7:11-17

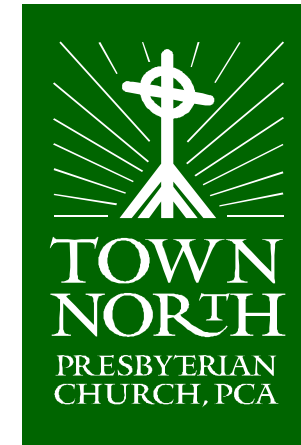
